Why Empower Hour is so critical right now:

Dress for Success services are more important than ever.

- 1. Dress for Success's COVID client impact survey showed that during the height of the pandemic:
 - 66% were not receiving an income
 - 72% were facing financial difficulties due to income/job loss
 - 51% were finding it difficult to afford groceries
 - 29% were at risk of losing their housing due to income/job loss
- 2. The COVID-19 pandemic has shone a light on the gender gap in Australia. Women have been disproportionately impacted, magnifying the barriers they already face in getting a job and staying in the workforce.
 - Women make up 47% of the workforce but are more likely to be in casual and insecure work, more likely to be employed part-time, and typically earn less per hour.¹
 - Women are more likely to be employed in the industries hit the hardest and with the longest road to recovery; hospitality, arts & recreation, higher education, and tourism.²
 - Remote learning, the loss of childcare and household support services led to a big rise in unpaid work during the lockdowns, disproportionally borne by women.³
 - Time out of the workforce is magnified for women, especially mothers. Six months out of work can add another \$100,000 to the \$2 million average lifetime earnings gap between men and women.⁴
 - Women in Australia retire with an average 35% less retirement savings than men.⁵
- 3. In 2022, whilst there is dialogue and movement, we are still far from achieving equality, whether in terms of age, disability, ethnicity, race, gender identity, sexuality, and socioeconomic status. For women, it's the intersection of these factors with gender bias that intensifies the experience of discrimination.

At Dress for Success, achieving this equality for women isn't just a talking point, it's a movement.

The impact of your donation

\$1000 Transform a woman's future with six months of one-on-one career coaching, resume drafting support, interview preparation, access to digital career support workshops and webinars, connections to prospective employers and her new interview outfit. Plus, a full week's wardrobe when she gets the job.

\$500 Transform a woman's future with three months of one-on-one career coaching, resume drafting support, interview preparation, access to digital career support workshops and webinars, connections to prospective employers and her new interview outfit. Plus, a full week's wardrobe when she gets the job.

\$350 Provides the support a woman needs to move from welfare to the workforce – professional clothing and access to digital workshops, resume and mock interview support.

\$25 Provides a woman one-on-one resume drafting support with an HR / Recruitment Specialist.
